

Job Site First Aid Kits

Emergency Preparedness

All job sites should have a readily accessible first aid kit equipped to ANSI Z 308.1-2003, *Minimal Requirements for Workplace First Aid Kits*. The ANSI standards are minimum, and job site first aid kits may need to be supplemented with additional supplies and equipment to handle severe injuries, injuries to multiple patients or CPR on two victims simultaneously. Review these safety tips on job site first aid kits with your employees.

Tool Box Tips

FIRST AID KIT BEST PRACTICES

- First aid kits must be made accessible to all employees during times of emergency.
- First aid kits must be inventoried regularly to ensure emergency supplies are ready.
- Consider first aid kits or bags that are portable.
- Kits shouldn't be kept behind locked doors.
- Employees on the job site must know the locations of first aid kits.
- Employees must know how to contact first aid responders on the job site.
- Post job site first aid responder contact information.
- Provide an accessible phone that dials out to 911.

MOUNT KITS IN THESE LOCATIONS:

- Work trucks and company cars.
- Job site work trailers.
- Job site warming or break trailers.
- Job site equipment with weatherproof cab.
- In the structure in a commonly used area.
